Can pupils identify the fruit and vegetables? How do they grow? What do fruit and vegetables need to grow?</p> <p>Sort the fruit and vegetables into different groups – colours, shapes, fruit and vegetables. Use hoops to create a Venn diagram to show differences.</p> <p>Taste a selection of fruit and vegetables – do they taste sweet/sour etc.?</p> <p>Begin to create a tally chart of favourite fruit or vegetables.
